### Instructional Options

#### 1 Traditional



Students attend classes in a face-to-face, on-campus setting

Traditional learning will follow our normal A/B block schedule five days per week. Should we have a COVID-related closure, we are ready to transition to our schoolwide remote alternative. Schoolwide remote instruction will include all traditional and F.A.L.C.O.N. virtual students.

### Transition from Traditional to Schoolwide Remote Instruction Criteria

#### Key factors for transition:

1. Critical number and/or percentage of current student cases at the school\*
2. Critical number and/or percentage of current employee cases at the school\*
3. Recommendations from the Department of Public Health
4. Recommendations from the Alabama Department of Education / The Diocese of Birmingham Catholic Schools

#### 2 F.A.L.C.O.N. Full Virtual\*



Students attend classes virtually/online, at-home setting (full academic year)

Parents opting for full virtual instruction for their child are required to email Mr. Lane Hill at [lhill@jp2falcons.org](mailto:lhill@jp2falcons.org) by **July 31, 2020**. (Individual requests to return to traditional instruction will be considered on a case-by-case basis.)

### The F.A.L.C.O.N. Full Virtual Edge

Virtual classes are taught by JP II faculty via Google classroom with continuity of high academic standards

Virtual student schedules will follow the standard JP II student day, (i.e., classes, lunch, power hour)

Virtual students may participate in extracurricular activities

Virtual students will retain athletic eligibility

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## Health & Wellness

Cleanliness and Hygiene	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Daily deep cleaning and disinfecting of classrooms, restrooms and common areas</li><li>• Sanitizer stations located around the school; hand washing/hygiene routines posted throughout the school</li><li>• All students and employees are required to wear solid color masks inside the building</li><li>• Daily temperatures will be taken as students and employees enter the building</li><li>• Students with temperatures of 100.4 should stay home until they are fever-free without medication for <b>72 hours</b> and <b>must</b> submit a doctor's written statement upon their return to school</li></ul>
Social Distancing	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Most classrooms are setup with the recommended 6' of distance from each student desk; classrooms where 6' of separation is not possible, students will be required to wear masks (i.e., labs)</li><li>• Protocols include line spacing, face masks required when social distancing cannot be maintained; staggered dismissal, procedures for check-in/check-out of students</li><li>• Students will not be assigned lockers, they may use their backpacks and take them from class to class</li></ul>
Child Nutrition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Meals will be eaten in the classroom</li><li>• Procedures will be in place for socially distanced meal distribution for students purchasing a school lunch</li><li>• All lunch purchases will be via FACTS SIS incidental billing (no cash purchases)</li><li>• Vending machines, water fountains, and microwaves will not be available for student use (student can still use the touchless water dispensers)</li></ul>
Parent/Guardian Guidance	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Monitor your child's temperature every morning. Students with a temperature of 100.4 or higher should stay home</li><li>• Monitor for the following COVID-19 symptoms every morning and keep your child home if present: cough, congestion, shortness of breath, or gastrointestinal symptoms</li><li>• Teach and reinforce proper hand washing, coughing into elbow/tissue; not sharing personal items/supplies; self-reporting any symptoms to a teacher or nurse</li><li>• Notify the school immediately if the student is exposed to COVID-19, the student is tested for COVID-19, or a household member tests positive for COVID-19</li></ul>
